MEMBERSHIP RIGHTS AND VOTING PROCEDURES

- (i) Each Registered Member shall have one vote on each question arising at any special or general meeting of the members.
- (ii) Registered Members shall designate their voting delegates prior to the Annual General Meeting by issuing an authorization. A Registered Member may appoint as their delegate an individual who shall be a member of the Registered Member Association to attend and act at the meeting on behalf of the Registered Member. The President or Secretary or like official of a Registered Member Association shall sign the written notice authorizing the said delegate to represent the Registered Member at Meetings of the O.R.A. Registration of the delegate shall be accepted until the commencement of the Meeting.
- (iii) No delegate shall have more than one vote.
- (iv) No Member shall be entitled to vote at Meetings of the O.R.A. unless he has paid all dues or fees payable by him as outlined by By-Law No.1 Article 23.
- (v) Associate and Honorary Life Members may attend Meetings of Members but their vote shall be carried by Regional Chair.
- (vi) If no delegate is appointed the Registered Members vote will be held by the Charter Member.

WORKSHOPS

Plans are being finalized to have three (3) workshops for the members.

1. Our Passion, Our Sport – Ringette Canada’s Long Term Athlete Development (LTAD) Model

Presented by two Ringette Canada representatives. Last year RC laid out its LTAD framework for optimal development of all ages, interests and abilities. The LTAD framework identifies specific athlete needs and ensures that all participants have the opportunity to reach their potential. This year RC will discuss their plans on the implementation of LTAD as well as an update on Ringette Canada.

2. Officiating And Its Role In The Evolution Of Ringette

Please join Officiating Coordinators Jeff Graham and Tania Pettitt-Tracey as they lead an open discussion on the role officiating has played and will play in the Evolution of Ringette. Discussion will include; advantage, distinction between levels of play, contact and aggression. Help us shape the future of our game by providing us with your perspective. Everyone is Welcome.

3. Mechanical Literacy in the Sport of Ringette: Skill Acquisition vs. Transference to Performance

Presented by Dr. Kelly Lockwood, Ph.D., Associate Professor, Department of Physical Education & Kinesiology, Brock University. Dr. Lockwood’s primary focus of research is on ice sport with an emphasis on both physiological and mechanical literacy through LTAD. A second arm of her research deals with equipment related to performance or more specifically, how skate sharpening effects performance. Brock University has secured funding a study on Ringette players looking at the skill acquisition through LTAD and whether skills developed transfer well to game play. This type of study is called a Time Motion Analysis (TMA), whereby game play is analysed for the purpose of further skill and player development. Dr. Lockwood will present an overview and what support she requires from the Ringette community to assist with data collection and analysis.
