Officiating Development Chairman's Report

I would just like to take this opportunity to say "Welcome back" and to tell you a little about myself. My name is Derek Burger and I have been involved with officiating ringette for 17 years. In the officiating world, I have been fortunate enough to hold positions as a Regional Officiating Co-ordinator, an instructor, and an evaluator. I have refereed at 8 Provincial Championships, 2 Ontario Winter Games and 2 National Championships. Aside from officiating in ringette, I am a fully certified Level II coach and have coached at the Tween, Junior and Open AA levels, winning 2 Provincial gold medals, 1 Provincial silver medal and a National silver medal. When not involved with officiating, I am employed with the Waterloo Regional Police Service as a Police Officer.

Early in August 2002, I met with the Officiating Development Committee to set a "path", if you will, of where we would like to see the Officiating **Development** Program head. You will notice that I highlighted the word "development". This is the area where the Committee felt we had been lacking. Only 8.5% of all officials in Ontario are provincially ranked (Level 3 or higher), with many of these being well on in their officiating careers; 70% of all officials are still at the 1C entry level!! The Committee agrees this is an unacceptable range.

A **Provincial Mentoring Program** has been established to increase the very low number of provincially ranked officials. This program is designed to identify officials who possess the skills and the desire to ascend to the Provincial levels at an earlier stage in their on-ice careers. Once identified, these officials will be evaluated often and be assisted in their development towards achieving a provincial rank.

The Committee has also changed in the way that ALL evaluations are received and entered into the field report. Without getting into the technical points of the procedure, we hope that the new procedures will assist in maintaining a more accurate assessment of officiating ranks province-wide. A list of evaluators is with this Ref-O-Gram.

It is hoped that with the commencement of the Mentoring Program and the increased monitoring of evaluations, we will have taken the first of many steps in boosting the positive development of officials.

Since this is a rule change year, ALL officials are required to take a clinic. All current level 1's and 2's must attend a 1/2 Refresher clinic while all level 3's and 4's must attend a refresher clinic. Any officials starting off new must take the full Level 1 NOCP clinic. There are new rules out there this year, folks, and it is your responsibility to know them. All of these clinics will be offered in your area, so contact your local referee-in-chief or your Regional Co-ordinator. All clinics may not be listed in this Ref-O-Gram and some may change. Please check the ORA website for current information.

In closing, thanks to the Officiating Development Committee for a very positive first meeting together. I look forward to more of the same in the future. I would also like to thank Rick Thomson, Al Fletcher, Steve Moritsugu and Laura Knowles for attending the Master Instructors Clinic in Ottawa. We look forward to your sharing your skills and wisdom. Finally, thanks to Ted Moritsugu for once again undertaking the task of giving the Ref-o-Gram its form.

Ever hear a referee say that as he saunters toward the ice? For a tournament organizer or an officiating supervisor, that attitude really grates.

Whether it's a tournament or a Provincial Championship game, every official should be ready to step on the ice as soon as it's resurfaced, or 10 minutes before game time, whichever is later.

It's our responsibility to help each event run on time.

"We can sit here; there's two seats.... Hey, did you just ref the last game? Well, we're not sitting next to you. You're an idiot!"

The Wash-out Signal

Use the wash-out signal in only two situations: one during play and one when you stop play.

Signal a wash-out during play only to indicate that a ring which has crossed two blue lines, untouched, may be played by the passing team.

In hockey, the wash-out is often signalled when a close play at a blue line is on-side. Maybe that's why some ringette referees want to wash out a close blue line play, to indicate no violation. If you do and your partner whistles a blue line violation, you'll both look bad.

Signal a wash-out at the net only when the ring is in the net but the goal is disallowed. You should whistle and then signal the wash out.

I saw a referee signal a wash-out when the ring deflected off the crossbar. The ring then bounced off the goalkeeper's back and into the net, so he stopped play and signalled a goal. Try explaining that to the coach who saw your wash-out signal but whose team was scored upon.

You should be paying attention to all close plays, so use the minimalist approach: if nothing happened (no blue line violation, no ring in the net), no signal is needed.

Of the fifteen referees at the 2002 Canadian Ringette Championships in Regina, seven were from Ontario; five of the six assignments in the three final games were handled by Ontario referees... The World Ringette Championships will take place in Edmonton in late November. Teams from Finland, Sweden and the USA will play Canada and a host team... The Canada Winter Games will be in Bathurst, NB, in late February. In preparation for these Games, Mississauga will host a Challenge Cup in mid-December...The Provincial A Championships are scheduled for early March in London...The Provincial AA Championships will be held a week later in Cambridge...The Canadian Ringette Championships will start in Waterloo in late March... Get details of these and other events in the list of Sanctioned Tournaments on the ORA website, www.ontario-ringette.com... The new Official Rules will be larger, with pages the same size as those in the Case Book, to save on printing costs... Canada has the dollar, Mexico the peso, but in Malaysia, it's the ringgit... Did you know that there's a politician in Quebec whose last name is Ringuette?

Who is that masked man, anyway?

He developed the Nu-Sty-Al aluminum ringette stick. He introduced the two-man, deep-left, officiating system to Ontario ringette. Interested in safety, he pushed for helmets for ringette referees, until they became mandatory. He was Ringette Canada's first referee-in-chief, after serving as the ORA's referee-in-chief. He and his wife were named to the Ontario Ringette Hall of Fame as Community Builders in 1985.
