Overheard:

Player: "How about the barging, ref?"

Official: "The what?"

Player: "The barging; you know!" Makes windmill motion

with hands.

Official: "You mean 'charging'?"

Player: "Charging, barging; whatever!"

You didn't hear what I said, did you?

You know what you mean, but is your message being received? During a game, when emotions can run high, referees should consider that a player or coach might take something they say the wrong way.

Example 1: At the end of a game, a coach tells the referee that he's protesting the game. The official replies, "That'll cost you," referring to the fee to file a protest. BUT, the coach thinks the ref is asking for a bribe to support the protest.

Example 2: Taking a player to the penalty box, the referee tells her, "You didn't get a body contact penalty because you just knocked over the ref, but for the earlier hit on #22 at the blue line." BUT, the player, upset and tired, hears, "... a body contact penalty because you just knocked over the ref..."

Remember: be clear, be brief and be aware of how your words may be misperceived in the situation. Often, the best course is to say little or nothing.
