Officiating Development Chairman's Report

Welcome to another season of officiating in Ontario. For those of you joining us for your first season, welcome! For those of you returning, welcome back!

As this is a rules change year there will be many challenges. Every official must take the appropriate refresher clinic to be eligible to officiate after December 15th. There will be two different refresher clinics held this fall, one for level 1 and 2 officials and one for level 3 and 4 officials. Please ensure that you attend the correct one.

There are two major procedural changes that will take place starting this season; registration and the upgrade process. Please ensure you read the information below carefully.

The procedure for registering to referee in the Province of Ontario has changed commencing this season.

There has been a long recognized problem with the way ringette officials in Ontario register, or as the problem exists, don't register. Unlike most sports, the officials are responsible for registering themselves as either independent officials (not affiliated with any association) or as a member of an association. It was decided in April 2005, that the officials in Ontario will be responsible for their own registration.

There are two methods that can be used to register. You must select the one that suits you best:

- 1. Fill out the enclosed form and return it to the registrar for the local association that you have been affiliated with in the past. Payment for your registration can be decided on by that association, with either you paying it yourself, or the association paying it for you. The association will forward the form to the ORA office with payment. You will be registered. Note that it is <u>your</u> responsibility to ensure that the ORA office receives both the registration form and payment by the deadline date.
- 2. Fill out the enclosed form and submit it to the ORA office yourself. You will need to enclose payment by either cheque or money order. You may still register as part of an association, and the ORA office will notify whichever association you choose when your registration is received. A receipt will be issued to you for submission for reimbursement, where applicable. Once payment is received, you are registered.

YOU MUST BE REGISTERED BY NOVEMBER 15, 2005 FOR THIS SEASON.

YOU MAY NOT OFFICIATE A GAME AFTER NOVEMBER 15, 2005 IF YOU DO NOT REGISTER.

FINES WILL BE LEVIED AGAINST ANY ASSOCIATION THAT USES UNREGISTERED OFFICIALS.

KEEP ALL RECORD OF YOUR REGISTRATION.

Registration cost for this season is \$25 for those registered solely as a referee. For those of you who are also registered as a coach or player, the registration fee is \$20, as your insurance and additional fees are covered through your player/coach registration.

The procedure for upgrade has changed in the Province of Ontario commencing this season.

At the April 2005 Standing Committee Meetings, the Officiating Development Committee (ODC) developed a process by where officials in Ontario must now apply for an upgrade in level once they have fulfilled the requirements of the level they are seeking to attain. This only applies to those wishing to move to, or within, level 3 and level 4. Upgrades within level 1 and level 2 will continue to be done through the Regional Coordinators and are not included in this process, though it is encouraged to do so, as this process will help expedite your upgrade. This process ensures that the official takes on a greater responsibility for their own development as they progress through the higher ranks of the National Officials Certification Program.

The "Request for Upgrade" form can be found on the ORA website under the "Officiating" section, and can be filled out online or printed out for mailing. It requires certain information from each of your evaluations and is relatively self-explanatory. Online requests will be forwarded to Ted Moritsugu, our new Evaluations Manager, for review. Should you wish to mail in your request form please forward it to Ted at the address indicated on the form. Once verification of the upgrade requirements for either level 3 or 4 is complete, the request will be forwarded to the Officiating Chair for consideration. Only once you have received confirmation of your upgrade in rank are you considered upgraded.

Beginning in 2005-2006, no officials in the Province of Ontario will be upgraded to, or within, level 3 or level 4 without submitting this form.

Requirements

Here is a reminder of the requirements for upgrade to each of the levels:

- Level 1 Completed the Level 1 Clinic and <u>1 evaluation</u> from a community level evaluator or higher or your local Referee in Chief recommending you to Level 1B or 1A.
- Level 2 Completed the Level 2/3 Clinic and <u>2 evaluations</u> from a community level evaluator or higher recommending you to Level 2C, 2B or 2A.
- Level 3 Completed the Level 2/3 Clinic and <u>3 evaluations</u> from a regional level evaluator or higher recommending you to Level 3C, 3B or 3A.
- Level 4 Completed the Level 4 Clinic and <u>4 evaluations</u> from a provincial level evaluator recommending you to Level 4C, 4B or 4A.

All upgrades require the approval of the either the Regional Coordinator or the Officiating Chair.

Also remember, that once you earn a new level, the process starts over (i.e. once you are a 2C, you need 2-2B evaluations to move to 2B).

On another note, I would like to thank Ted Moritsugu for the many years of creative input as the editor of the Ref-O-Gram. Ted is stepping down this year and taking on the position of Evaluations Manager. I think that we can all be assured that Ted will tackle this new position with the detail that only he can provide.

In closing, I would like to wish the best of luck to all the officials from across the province. Whether you are reffing a recreational game on a Sunday night, doing the final game of a tournament, working at the Provincials or the NRL, remember it is your **job** to ensure the game is played fairly and within the rules that make this game the greatest game on ice. The upgrade process has changed for those of you wishing to move to, or through levels 3 and 4. Please ensure you have read the information in the Chairman's Report and understand what is required. For those of you moving through levels 1 and 2, nothing has changed.

I would like to congratulate Geri Lamers on being the recipient of the "Provincial Official of the Year" award for the 2004-2005 season. Geri officiates locally out of Cambridge and had an outstanding season where she officiated at the Provincial AA Championships in Ottawa and was the Ontario representative at the Eastern Canadian Tween Championships, where she officiated the final game between New Brunswick and Ontario.
